Early Literacy, Communication and Language

This half term the children will be learning to:

Identify sounds in words and begin to recognise the phonemes from different letters in the alphabet

Begin to identify some sounds during oral blending games

Begin to make predictions about a story, sometimes supported by an adult

Know that blending sounds makes words

Join in with repetition within stories

Talk about different parts of the story



Mathematical Development

This half term the children will be learning how to:

- Solve real world mathematical problems using numbers 1-5
- Describing routes
- Comparative addition of numbers to 5
- Compare objects relating to size, length, weight and capacity

Counting everyday objects at home and recognising numbers and shapes when you are out and about will be extremely helpful for your child's mathematical development.

Jigsaw (PSHE)

At Littlemoor we take great pride in ensuring that we create well-rounded, happy and confident children who are ready to learn.

This half-term, our Jigsaw focus will be Relationships.

Through this topic we will discuss some important issues including making friends, falling out, bullying and also being kind.



Physical Development

This half term the children will be learning:

To hold the pencil confidently, using the tripod grip.

To use scissors confidently and make straight, zig zag and circular snips using one hand.

To run skilfully and be able to negotiate space.

To be aware of obstacles whilst running, riding a scooter/bike etc and display some spatial awareness.

Religious Education and Jigsaw RE

The children will be learning how to work as part of a group, taking turns and sharing fairly, understanding that groups of people need agreed values and codes of behaviour, including adults and children, to work together harmoniously. Children listen with enjoyment to stories, songs and poems from different communities and traditions and respond with relevant comments, questions or actions.

We will also be reading stories linked to different religions and faiths such as Christianity, Islam and Sikhism. The children will take part in their own daily quiet reflection time.

If you have any questions about how Religious Education is taught to your child, your child's class teacher would be happy to discuss this.

Expressive Arts and Design

This half term our focus will be:

- Creating closed shapes with continuous lines and begin to use these shapes to represent objects.
- Draw with increasing complexity and detail, such as representing a face with a circle and including details.
- Use drawing to represent ideas like movement or loud noises.

Celebrating Famous Artists:

At Littlemoor we learn about, discover and explore the artwork of a different famous artist every half-term. This term our focus will be on **Wassily Kandinsky**, exploring lines and shapes.



Music

At Littlemoor we love music and songs are used constantly throughout the day across many subjects. In our music lessons over the next few weeks your child will be learning these new songs:

Big bear funk Hickory dickory dock
Twinkle twinkle little star Baa baa black sheep

Sing as much as you can with your child at home – songs are a great way to learn new words, understand melody and to have fun.
