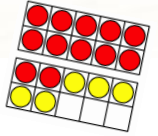


Reception Curriculum Newsletter



Literacy

This half-term our core text for Literacy will be Goldilocks and the One Bear by Leigh Hodgkinson. As the children prepare for their transition into Key Stage One, we will be focusing on securing foundational writing skills, particularly using finger spaces, capital letters and full stops when writing simple sentences.

The children will also have opportunities to further develop their speaking and listening skills by engaging with carefully selected texts and being supported to articulate their understanding of what they have read.

Please support your child in writing sentences independently at home. This is something that requires plenty of practice and children can often find remembering their sentence challenging when writing.



Summer Two



Last day of term:

Mathematics

This half-term we will be consolidating all of our learning so far. We will be ensuring that the children are secure in their understanding of numbers to ten including finding one more and one less than a given number, subitising, recalling key number facts and solving simple addition and subtraction problems.

We will also be spending time considering number patterns when counting beyond twenty, recalling facts such as doubles and odd and even numbers, and will spend time developing our sharing and grouping skills.

Please continue to practice counting with your child and helping them to write numbers up to 20.



Jigsaw (PSHE)

This half-term our Jigsaw topic is 'Changing Me'. The children will be learning more about their bodies and some ways they can keep healthy. We will also look at some differences between babies, toddlers, children and adults.

The children will be encouraged to talk about how they feel about moving into Year One. We will share what we are looking forward to doing and also any worries we might have.

As we move into Summer, we will also be taking time to teach the children about the importance of water safety and importance of being safe in the sun.

Phonics

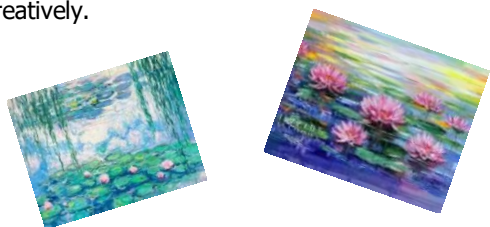
As our Reception children begin to get ready for their move to Year One – phonics is of the upmost importance! The children should now be able to speedily say their Set 1 Sounds and be developing their confidence with Set 2 sounds.

Please be reminded that the expected reading level for a child at the end of Reception is a green book.

In Summer 2, the children will be inspired by Claude Monet as they explore painting spring and summer scenes. They will focus on flowers, ponds, and garden settings, using observation skills to notice shapes, colours, and details in the natural world. Through sensory paint exploration, they will experiment with making marks using brushes and different techniques, building control and confidence. The children will mix colours carefully to represent the soft tones of summer and begin to understand how layering paint can create depth and texture in their artwork. Key vocabulary such as colour, mix, paint, brush, flower, pond, garden, observe, and spring will support their learning as they develop their artistic skills and express their ideas creatively.



Understanding of the World

As Summer begins, we will be beginning to learn about minibeasts and life cycles! We will be looking at the features of different minibeasts, and we will be taking part in lots of outdoor learning to observe minibeasts within our school grounds. We will also spend some time revisiting special jobs that people have – especially thinking about who helps us at home, at school and in our community.

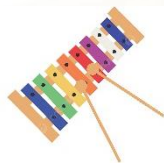
The rest of the half term will be spent building on topics that we have covered throughout the year – learning about changes in technology over time, different places such as towns, cities, and we will spend some time thinking about the seaside.

Music

Our music lessons this half-term will revisit some of the songs we have learnt throughout the year. We will also continue to build on our instrument skills by learning a new piece on the glockenspiels.

We will also be incorporating some dance into our sessions. We will experiment to see how different types of music make us move differently.

Sing as much as you can with your child at home – songs are a great way to learn new words, understand melody and to have fun.
